Uniform Policy

Rationale

At Kaurna Plains School R - 12 we believe that the wearing of school uniform and school colours:

- promotes pride in our school
- enhances our public image
- reduces peer pressure
- promotes opportunity for equal participation
- encourages appropriate clothing for school activities
- is economically viable
- encourages responsible behavior
- wearing school uniforms/colours put students in the mindset to start the school day

SCHOOL COLOURS: Red, yellow and black only

Tops School top preferred. OR Red, yellow or black polo shirts, windcheater,

jumper, skivvies, jacket or cardigan (with or without school logo).

Bottoms Black bottoms/ Jeans, no ripped Jeans.

Dress Summer dress in school uniform

Yr 6 and Yr 12 Students Year 6 and Year 12 students have an option of ordering a Commemorative top.

Footwear Suitable sturdy footwear. Sneakers, lace up plain black rubber soled shoes, or sandals that

support, cover and protect the foot.

Hats School hats are compulsory in Term 1 and Term 4. Beanies in school colours can be worn

outside during winter. Caps are not part of the school uniform.

Jewellery Necklaces should not be worn as they are unsafe

- Students will be celebrated for wearing their uniform. Non-compliance will be discussed with parents.
- School will support any challenges when accessing uniform.

Casual Days

On casual dress days students are able to wear non-uniform clothing. Clothing and shoes worn on these days must be appropriate for school, learning and play. Clothes that do not cover shoulders and very short skirts or shorts must not be worn. Clothing with offensive slogans or images is not appropriate for school wear.
